REGISTRATION

When your enrollment in Family Lives Worth Living is approved, you will receive a permission number from the instructor, Lynn Englund to register as a student in CI 5900—Special Topics in Family, Youth and Community: Family Lives Worth Living. Registration opens **April 10** for degree-seeking students at the University of Minnesota and **April 17** for non-degree-seeking individuals and any student enrolled at another college or university (all are welcome and eligible to register for Summer Session courses). Students enrolled by May 1 must register for the course by May 20.

COST AND PAYMENT DUE

The costs for the course are:

The number of single and double-occupancy rooms available will vary with enrollment. If enrollments require double-occupancy, each student who shares a room will receive a program fee refund of \$150.

Students' room occupancy preferences will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. Applicant's room occupancy preference: _____.

The University will bill students enrolled in the course for the total cost of tuition and fees. The entire amount will be due on July 4, 2007.

Once enrolled in the course, should you decide not to register for the course, or you withdraw from the course, you will still be charged for and will be responsible for paying \$400 of the program fee. Should the course not enroll enough students to be held, you will owe nothing and any program fees paid will be refunded.

In addition to the costs of the course, there are also personal expenses associated with the course. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the course; the instructor will help to arrange car-pooling among students to reduce gas consumption and expenses. A small amount of spending money for personal items and toiletries may be needed.

STATEMENT OF INTENT TO PARTICIPATE
